



Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to once again provide you with information about the Mooresville Graded School District through the North Carolina School Report Card. This annual report card contains data, statistics and other important measures regarding student performance, class size, attendance, school safety, instructional resources and teacher quality, both for the district as well as for each school.

In 2015 - 2016, Mooresville Graded School District realized several achievement highlights. As a district, the Mooresville Graded School District grade-level proficiency was at 70 percent, which was fifth in the state of North Carolina among all 115 school districts. This percentage is 12 points higher than the state average of 58 percent. There were several strong points in reviewing the EOG/EOC results. All End-of-Course scores within MGSD ranked in the top 10 in the state out of 115 districts with Math 1 results at 3rd, English 10 at 8th and Biology at 10th. All End-of-Grade math scores ranked 4th in the state out of 115 school districts, 5th grade science ranked 9th in the state, and all sixth grade EOG combined scores put them at 2nd in the state. MGSD third grade reading scores were ranked 6th in the state. Mooresville High School was in the top 3 percent in the state in academic growth out of all public schools including charters. Mooresville Graded School District also excelled in its Annual Measurable Objectives by meeting 97 percent of its participation targets. All of these results are evidence that MGSD is pushing students to excel at all levels.

While the North Carolina Report Card offers much information about our schools, there is much more to know about the unique strategies and plans our district has underway to provide the best educational opportunities for every student. We remain committed to excellence – for our schools, our students, and our staff. Please join us in our efforts to create the very best school system in North Carolina.
